

MIDA Uniform Requirements

WHY DO DANCERS WEAR A UNIFORM?

Dance is a discipline and having a uniform promotes unity and professionalism in the studio that will translate to daily life routines. Please read through the following uniform regulations and contact midance@rrcwb.ca if you require further information.

UNIFORM GUIDELINES

- For your safety, no jewelry in class (e.g. watches, dangling earrings, bracelets, or ankle bracelets).
- Plan for back to back classes and wear items that can quickly transition between classes. In the case a dancer does not have the ability to change between classes, ballet will always take priority.
- Undergarments: Tights are worn instead of underwear. If your dancer requires it, only sports/dance bras should be worn. Dance belts are available for purchase on our Johnny Brown store for those who require them.
- Hair: Dancers must have hair in a slicked back bun for ballet and mini classes. Hair may be in a bun or ponytail for other styles.
- Please arrive with hair properly slicked back for the appropriate dance style prior to the start of class.
- No logos may show on t-shirts.
- Bellybuttons should not be visible during any style of dance.
- Additional uniform guidelines may be set for those who participate in ballet examinations.

| MIDA Mini 1 (3 years old) | Traditional Female Attire Pink bodysuit, black shorts, no shoes until January. In January, your child will wear pink ballet slippers Traditional Male Attire Black sport shorts, solid plain black tank or t-shirt, no shoes until January. In January, your child will wear black ballet slippers. |
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| MIDA Mini 2 (4 years old) | Traditional Female Attire Purple bodysuit, black shorts, pink tights, pink ballet slippers. Hair pulled back. Traditional Male Attire Black sports short, solid plain black tank or t-shirt with no name brands, black ballet slippers. |
| MIDA Mini 3 (5 years old) | ■ Navy bodysuit, black shorts, pink tights. Hair pulled back. ■ For shoes: Dancers in this class will require ballet flats in September. For example, If your dancer is in the ballet-tap class, they will need tap shoes starting in January. If they are in the ballet-jazz class, they will use their ballet shoes during the jazz section of the year Traditional Male Attire Black sports short, solid plain black tank or t-shirt with no name brands. | BALLET | Traditional Female Attire Black leotard and ballet pink tights. Pink split-sole canvas ballet flats Traditional Male Attire White fitted dance shirt and fitted black shorts, pants or tights. Black split-sole ballet canvas flats and thin black ankle socks. |
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| JAZZ | Traditional Female Attire ■ Black leotard, caramel tights and fitted black shorts or pants. ■ Beige jazz shoes. Traditional Male Attire ■ Black fitted t-shirt, loose black shorts or fitted black pants. ■ Black jazz shoes and thin black ankle socks. |
| LYRICAL/CONTEMPORARY | Traditional Female Attire Black leotard, caramel tights and fitted black shorts or pants. Beige half soles/foot undies/beige apolla shocks with grip Traditional Male Attire Black fitted t-shirt, loose black shorts or fitted black pants. Beige half-sole shoes. |

| TAP | Traditional Female Attire Black leotard or t-shirt, caramel tights and fitted black shorts or pants. Black lace-up tap shoes. Traditional Male Attire Black fitted t-shirt, loose black shorts or fitted black pants. Black lace-up tap shoes. |
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| MUSICAL THEATRE | Traditional Female Attire Any colour leotard, tights and/or fitted shorts or pants. Beige jazz shoes. Traditional Male Attire Any colour fitted t-shirt, loose shorts or fitted pants. Black jazz shoes and thin black ankle socks. |
| НІР НОР | Any black t-shirt or hoodie and any baggy black pants or shorts (no jeans). Any black sneakers with white bottoms (non-marking, must be indoor only). |
| ACRO | Traditional Female Attire Black leotard or sport bra and, fitted black shorts. Bare feet and bare legs required. Traditional Male Attire Black fitted t-shirt and, fitted black shorts. Bare feet and bare legs required. |
